

# THE FGASA APPRENTICE FIELD GUIDE (NQF2) CERTIFICATE



Register as a member with The Field Guides Association of Southern Africa (FGASA). Register via [www.fgasa.org.za](http://www.fgasa.org.za)

You need to register and pay the required fees

**Choose to receive the required Learning Materials** either in digital format, or hard copy. These include the Nature Guide Learner Manual, The Art of Nature Guiding, the Field Guide Study Guide & Workbook & green logbook.

Complete the Apprentice Field Guide (NQF2) **Workbook** while studying to help you to prepare for the theory examination. **Compulsory.**

**Register online for the Apprentice Field Guide (NQF2) theory examination** as well as to pay the **exam fee**

You need to be **declared competent** (pass) the FGASA Apprentice Field Guide (NQF2) theory examination (75%).

You may now book your practical assessment (directly with a FGASA assessor).

You need to submit your **completed** FGASA Apprentice Field Guide (NQF2) **Workbook (theory and practical)** to your assessor for assessment.

You need to be **declared competent** (pass) for the FGASA Apprentice Field Guide (NQF2) **practical assessment.**

The assessment is SITE specific. You will not obtain a full province.

You will be awarded the **FGASA Apprentice Field Guide (NQF2) qualification** (*CATHSSETA NQF2 Certificate*).

You can now start logging active guiding experience in the FGASA Green Field Guide Logbook working towards doing the FGASA Field Guide (NQF4) Certificate.



You will need to submit all required further documentation to the FGASA offices for correct registration of your new qualification with CATHSSETA.

A valid first aid certificate is a requirement for all FGASA qualifications

You need to be registered with the National Department of Tourism in order to guide legally.

You need:

- Your FGASA certificate
- Your CATHSSETA certificate
- A certified copy of your first aid
- A certified copy of your ID
